

- Release the slide stop.
- Point the weapon at a safe backstop and pull the trigger to verify that the unit is properly installed and functioning.



Disassembly:

- Remove the magazine if in place.
- Retract the action/slide and engage the slide stop as in Step 3 of the assembly procedure.
- Press gently on the back of the Laser cartridge with your finger and unscrew the Safety Nut from the Safety Pipe.
- Unscrew the Safety Pipe and remove from the barrel.
- Point the barrel up, while positioning your hand, palm upward, under the magazine well.
- If necessary, shake the weapon, and the laser cartridge will slide out through the magazine well.

Remove battery when laser cartridge is not in use.

Maintenance:

The Laser cartridge is an electronic device and should always be treated as such.

- Store in original case.
- Wipe the Laser cartridge only with a soft fabric - do not immerse in solvents or cleaning agents.
- Clean the laser lens using a glass cleaner and cotton swab.

Please note: If you are using the SureStrike in multiple firearms which have substantially different firing pin strengths, you may need to use a different Action Cap for each firearm.

Warranty:

Laser Ammo warrants that this product shall be free from material defects and defects in workmanship for the earlier occurrence of: A period of one (1) year from the date of the purchaser's receipt of the product, or; 5000 laser "shots". Notice of any warranty claim must be received by Laser Ammo, in writing, prior to the expiration of the warranty period.

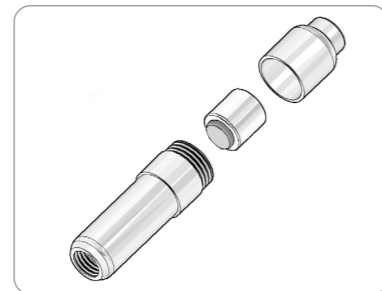
- Unload the weapon.
- Physically and visually inspect chamber, bore, and magazine well to ensure that all ammunition has been removed.
- Unload ammunition from any magazines that will be used in training.
- Store ammunition in an area that is separate from your training area.

⚠ Always personally verify that all ammunition has been removed before training.

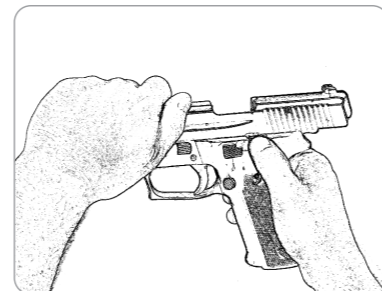
Do not allow any live ammunition in the training area.

Warning - firearms can cause serious injuries or death.

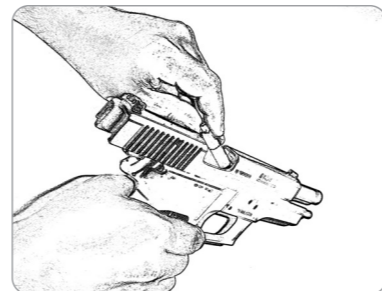
- Unscrew the Laser cartridge and insert the battery pack into the Laser cartridge according to the drawing (flat side facing up).
- Reassemble the Laser cartridge carefully.
- Verify the threading is fully closed and that there is no gap.



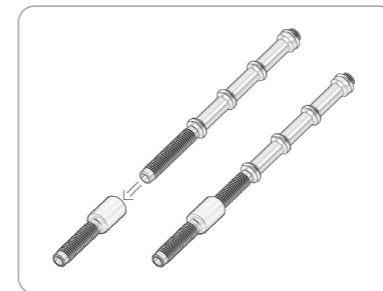
- Retract the action/slide and engage the slide stop in the open position.
 - Make sure the action/slide is held firmly by the stop.
- ⚠** Do not continue if the slide is not held firmly or if the slide stop is not in good working order.



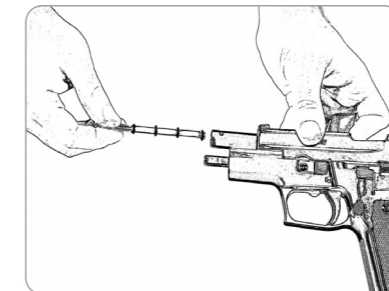
- While pointing the barrel down, insert the Laser cartridge into the handgun by "dropping" it, laser first, through the slide opening into the chamber.



- For barrel length between 2.8" to 4.1" continue to step 6.
- For a longer barrel, connect the pipe extension to the Safety Pipe by threading them together tightly.
- If needed, a long safety pipe (up to 4.7") or additional extensions are available from Laser Ammo.



- Press gently on the back of the Laser cartridge with your finger.
- Carefully insert the Safety Pipe's short threaded end into the barrel.
- Screw the Safety Pipe into the Laser cartridge until you feel mild resistance.



- Screw the Safety Nut onto the Safety Pipe, until it tightens against the barrel. Please note the safety nut can be reversed for a longer reach.
